storm around: to go about in a fury

storm out (of some place): to burst out of some place angrily

4. The boss stormed at the secretary because she forgot to give him the files.

## Intermediate

There is going to be trouble: A storm is brewing

To survive a difficult situation: Weather the storm

In an emergency any solution will do, even one that wouldn't normally be acceptable: Any port in a storm

to make trouble or to show great annoyance about something because you are unhappy. Usually when it isn't necessary: Kick up a storm
